Digital Library of CHS Greece

#### The Digital Library Program of CHS Greece begins

This educational program aims at introducing participants to the digital methods used by academic institutions such as Harvard and CHS to disseminate knowledge. The program is adjusted to the educational level and needs of the attending students, offering two parts; part I offers an introduction to research techniques in the Digital Library's databases, and Part II introduces young researchers to specialized techniques for research, assessment, and citation of digital resources.

All educational visits require prior coordination with CHS Greece.

For individuals wishing to use the <u>Digital Library or the study</u> room, CHS Greece, in compliance with all relevant safety measures, hosts up to ten (10) visitors daily.
